



## ALICE RAP PUBLICATION GUIDELINES

An agreement based on the requirements of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (www.icmje.org) is included in the Consortium agreement.

## Basic points:

- Whenever possible, and to promote equality of access as encouraged by the European Commission FP7 programme, manuscripts should be published in open access journals or in journals where open access can be provided through a fee to the project (considered an eligible cost).
- Authors should make reasonable attempts to negotiate self-archiving of pre- or postpublication reprints with the publishing journal.
- Authorship and order in signatures established according to standard ICMJE criteria (http://www.icmje.org/ethical lauthor.html).
- Conflicts of Interests statements added according to ISAJE criteria (<a href="http://www.parint.org/isajewebsite/ethics.htm">http://www.parint.org/isajewebsite/ethics.htm</a>;
  <a href="http://www.parint.org/isajewebsite/farmcon.pdf">http://www.parint.org/isajewebsite/farmcon.pdf</a>).
- All scientists participating in the relevant work packages (or Area leader) for any paper will be consulted and/or involved as authors.
- Authorship can include 'the ALICE RAP project'.
- A standard acknowledgments paragraph and disclaimer (see below) must be included in all publications (in academic journals or otherwise) coming out of the ALICE RAP project.
- Where possible, i.e. on posters, hand-outs or flyers, the European Union emblem should appear along with the paragraph acknowledging funding. - Copies of all papers submitted and the final paper once accepted will be sent to the Coordinating Team (<u>fleur.braddick@gmail.com</u>, <u>reynolds@clinic.ub.es</u>). Justification will be provided for publication of non-open access papers at the time of reporting.
- Once accepted, a protected PDF copy of the article will be e-mailed to all ALICE RAP partners.
